

## Guidelines for Authors

### International Conference TIMTED 2023 “Current Economic Trends in Emerging and Developing Countries” (8-9 June, 2023)

TIMTED Conference welcomes electronic submissions of full papers or extended abstracts, sent in Word 97-2003 format (until 03 April, 2023), via email, at [timited@e-uvt.ro](mailto:timited@e-uvt.ro)

#### Submission rules

Authors can submit a maximum of two **full papers or extended abstracts**.

Write your text in good English (American or British, not a mixture of them) and prepare your manuscript (full paper or extended abstract) considering the following guidelines.

**Please make sure to mention your co-authors’ names on submission.** Co-authors’ names will be published in the programme and conference abstract book exactly as indicated in the paper(s) / extended abstract(s) submitted.

#### Format

**There is no strict limit to the length of the full papers submitted.** However, the length of **extended abstracts shall range between 1600 and 2200 words, and have the same structure as the full papers** (introduction, literature review, methodology, results and conclusions, and key references).

**If your full paper will be considered for publication in one of the journals associated to TIMTED 2023** (see list of journals below), **the author(s) shall comply with journal requirements:**

The first page of the full paper/extended abstract should include the title, author(s) name and affiliation, abstract (between 100 and 250 words), keywords and JEL codes.

Papers should include a clear indication of the research objective, research methods, major results, implications and key references.

#### Full papers / Extended abstracts should be:

Single spaced throughout the whole text

Times New Roman 12-point font (except for the title which should be Times New Roman 14-pointfont, and list of references which should be Times New Roman 10-pointfont)

A4 size page formatting

2.5 cm margins on all sides

**Content order:**

**Page 1** must include the **title of the paper/extended abstract, author(s) first name, LAST NAME (with capital letters) and affiliation**, and an **abstract of 100 to 250 words** summarizing the research aim and objective(s), findings and conclusions.

Please list **three to five key words** and **two or three JEL codes**.

The rest of the paper will follow: **body of the paper/extended abstract** including tables, figures, equations etc.

**References** will appear at the end of the paper. For extended abstracts, due to limited space, we recommend listing a maximum of 10 key references.

**FULL PAPER / EXTENDED ABSTRACT TEMPLATE:**

**Title** (centred, bold and Times New Roman, 14-pointfont)

**First author's name and SURNAME, institutional identifying information** (centred, bold and Times New Roman, 12-point font)

**Second author's name and SURNAME, institutional identifying information** (centred, bold and Times New Roman, 12-point font)

**Last author's name and SURNAME, institutional identifying information** (centred, bold and Times New Roman, 12-point font)

**Abstract** (justified, Times New Roman, 12-point font)- 100 to 250 words

*Compliance to the word limits required in order to facilitate standardisation of the publication of the conference abstract book. No indentation (spaces or tab stop) of paragraphs should be used.*

**Keywords:** (justified, italic, Times New Roman, 12-pointfont) – add three to five keywords

**JEL Codes:** (justified, italic, Times New Roman, 12-pointfont) – add two or three JEL Codes, from the list available: <https://www.aeaweb.org/econlit/jelCodes.php?view=jel>

**1. Heading 1** (centered, bold and Times New Roman, 12-pointfont)

The rest of the paper will follow. Headings will be numbered with Arabic numerals and the text will be justified, Times New Roman, 12-point font.

**2. Figures, tables and equations**

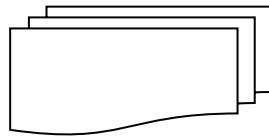


Fig.1. Example of a figure caption

If you include figures and tables, try to place them so they appear entirely on one page only. Table heads should appear above the tables; figure captions should be added below the figures. All figures and tables should be cited in the text. Use the abbreviation “Fig. 1”, even at the beginning of a sentence.

If you use equations, please number them consecutively. Equations should be centred, and numbered within parentheses; equation numbers are to be positioned flush right, using tab stops:

$$(x + a)^n = \sum_{k=0}^n \binom{n}{k} x^k a^{n-k} \tag{1}$$

**1.1. Heading 2** (left, bold and Times New Roman, 12-pointfont)

Headings are organizational devices that guide the reader through your paper. There are two types: component headings and text headings. Component headings identify the different components of your paper and are not subordinated to each other. Text headings organize topics on a relational and hierarchical basis.

**References**

For in-text citation, papers with more than three authors will be cited using the first author’s surname followed by “et al..

Cite the author(s) surname and year of publication. Include page numbers within the citation when directly quoting the authors' words. If the author(s) name is used in the text, put the date in parentheses. APA style should be used for the list of references (justified, Times New Roman, 10-point font). Due to limited space, for extended abstracts we recommend listing a maximum of 10 key references. A few examples are given below.
